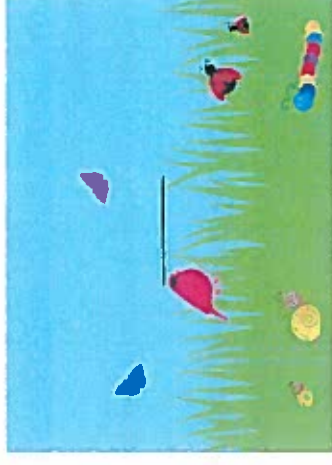

Our curriculum theme for the whole school this term is African Heritage.

In Year 3 we will be learning about North Africa.

We will learn about: North African culture and how it is linked to family heritage. We will also be identifying countries, capital cities, languages, religions and landmarks related to North Africa.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development (PSED)

This term we will Learn:

- To Maintain a focus on high academic and behavioural expectations
- To Explore our own heritage, family and values
- To Value the opinions and ideas of others

Communication, Language and Literacy Development (CLLD)

In English this term we will Learn:

- To write a summary about 'Nadine dreams of home.'
- To investigate the history of important individuals in North Africa.
- To write a diary entry as Nadine and we will focus on summarising different characters in 'Nadine dreams of home.'

Problem Solving and Reasoning about Numbers (PSRN)

In Mathematics this term we will learn:

- To develop confidence in multiplication facts for numbers up to 12.



Knowledge and Understanding of the World (KUW)

- Look at religions, music and languages linked to African cultures and heritage.

Physical Development (PD)

This term we will learn:
