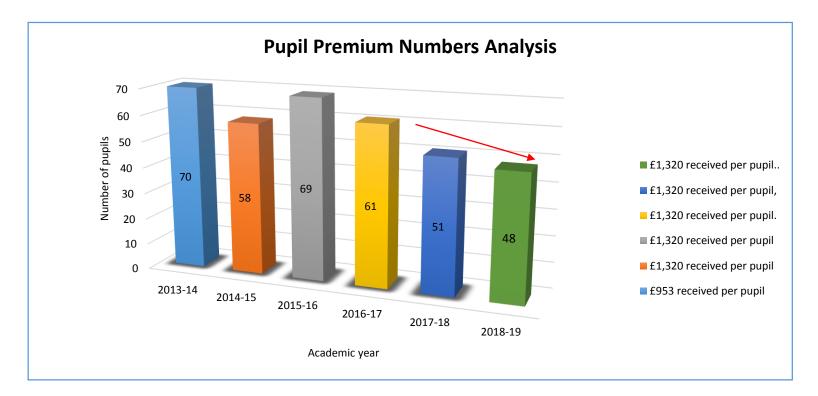
Pupil Premium Priorities

Narrative

- Over the overtime we have seen fluctuation in the numbers of PPG pupils at Colvestone.
- Although the funding per pupil has increased since 2013 the overall amount that we receive is decreasing due to a fall in the number of pupils eligible for the grant.
- We will see another drop the next academic 10 pupils leave the school at the end of the academic year.
- There is a strong focus on raising standards for all PPG pupils at the Expected standard. Increasing the proportion working at the Higher Standard and closing the attainment and progress gap between PPG and Non-PPG pupils.
