Personal, Social and Emotional Development (PSED)

Listen to The Colour Monster by Anna Llenas

- Can you show feelings using your face or maybe by making a sound?
- Can you think of a time when you felt a certain way? Use the sentence starter 'I feel... when I...'

Daily Activities:

Maths – practice chanting up to 50. Try counting in 2s or in 10s!

Reading – share a story with an adult. Try some levelled eBooks on the Oxford Owl website. Remember to point as you read.

Phonics – choose a sound every day and find 5 things that start with that sound. Practice reading the sounds we know.

Spellings – practice reading or writing a few HFWs every day - a list can be found in your reading record book or in your homework book. Make your own flashcards if you want a challenge! <http://www.ictgames.com/littleBirdSpelling/>

Key Question:

Up in the Sky – What different birds can fly?

TOPIC: Literacy / Understanding of the World

- Can you retell the Puffin Peter story in your own words to an adult? What happened at the beginning, middle and end?
- Write a list of birds in the story that can fly. What other bird names do you know?
- Can you draw and write about your favourite bird?

Use the internet or books to find out more about different birds. What birds can or can't fly? Can you describe some similarities and differences between birds that you know?

Mathematics

Counting in twos: Find objects in your house that come in pairs. Socks? Shoes? Maybe even parts of your body! Can you count them in twos? 2, 4, 6, 8... what comes next?

Doubling: When we double we add the same number together. We get twice as much! Draw a ladybird – a circle with a line down the middle. Can you draw 3 spots on one side? Now double the spots by drawing 3 more on the other side. Try to write an addition number sentence to match your ladybird (e.g. $3 + 3 = 6$). Can you make some more double ladybirds?
