

# HELP SAVE COLVESTONE NURSERY PLAYGROUND!



There is one last chance for you to help us to stop a 3-storey building going up on the concrete triangle next to Colvestone Primary School Nursery class outdoor area. **It will put the Nursery outdoor classroom in shadow for most of the school day, for most of the year.**

We need your help to tell the Government Planning Inspectorate if you don't want this to happen. The more people who do this, the better. If you have objected before thank you, but we must now object again!

We have until next Thursday, 28 October, to send comments to the Inspectorate.

This **really is the last chance we have to stop this development** The Inspector has the power to refuse permission and there is no further appeal mechanism.

Please take a few minutes to send in your comments before next Thursday. Here's how:

2. See the box on the right called "Search for a case" and type in this number: **3274827**
3. You will see the summary page of the case by Harvest Properties against Hackney Council, click on the button at top right "Make representation"
4. Click "Save and continue"
5. Click on "Interested Party / Person" and fill in your name and address, then click "Save and continue"
6. Click "No" to the question "Are you acting on behalf of a company, group or organisation?" (unless you are, which would be great)
7. You can just add brief comments in the box and/or attach documents
8. "Save and continue" and then "Submit"

In August 2021 the Nursery outdoor classroom was granted an "Asset of Community Value" status. Here's why we're against this proposal:

- It is a **designated outdoor learning space** used by the children all day as part of their early years curriculum (it is NOT simply a playground!).
- **Children's health and well-being**: the proposed building will mean that this outside learning area will be mostly in the shade, especially in the winter.
- **Impact on the early year's curriculum**: Growing plants and vegetables is an important part of the Early Years curriculum – science, art and writing. The flower bed and planters will be in the shade much of the year, affecting the growth of plants.
